WHITTLE'S

THE HISTORY OF BINSWOOD HALL

1847 Binswood Hall was built. Architecture by Daniel Squirhill.

1848 Opened as Leamington College for Boys. The aims of the college were to provide 'For the sons of nobility, clergy and gentry, a sound classical and mathematical education in accordance with the principles of the established church'

1903 The Society of the Sacred Heart (French) purchased the building for £10,000. It was used as a training school for young girls brought over from the convents in France. Nuns extended the premises and added a new wing in the north-west corner of the hall.

1920 Warwickshire County Council purchased the site for £37,000 to house Leamington College. The school became very successful and had upwards of 650 pupils and over 50 teaching staff. The school's most recognised pupil being Sir Frank Whittle.

1979 Selective education in Leamington ended and local grammar schools were taken away. Binswood was then used as North Leamington Sixth From College.

1994 The Sixth Form College was merged with the 11 - 16 school, meaning the building was abandoned again.

2013 The building was bought by Audley Group and was magnificently restored and opened as a luxury retirement village, centred around Binswood Hall which is home to the Audley Club which includes Whittle's Restaurant, Bar and Bistro, Library and Health Club. The restaurant was named after the school's most famous pupil Sir Frank Whittle, who invented the jet engine.
